\$300,000+ Community Investment Milestone!

BNDCE is very excited to announce that it has now reached a significant milestone contributing in excess of \$300,000 to community projects and initiatives since its formation.

- \$104,200 contributed to 8 major projects
- \$138,565 (127 grants) distributed via the twice-yearly grants programs
- \$43,150 to purchase 21 Life Saving Defibrillators
- 6 Joint Community Enterprise projects
 totalling over \$14,000
- · 27 other projects supported totalling \$12,059.

New HPV apparel for Epsom Primary School

The Epsom Primary School is preparing to begin full human powered vehicle (HPV) racing in 2021, competing in 3 events. The school has a second-hand vehicle and will use the \$2,000 grant to purchase footwear, team uniforms and equipment to participate in the 2021 events.

The HPV project is aimed at developing the students design, collaboration, health, fitness and community engagement skills.

Due to COVID, the 2020 Weeroona College Bendigo presentation night was hosted as an online event. BNDCE were pleased to continue our support of these student awards.

Joint Projects

Bendigo Health Books for Babies program

This is the second time BNDCE has supported the Bendigo Health Books for Babies initiative, contributing \$3,000 to the overall total.

This program is to encourage new mothers to introduce literacy at an early age with young babies and toddlers and includes a board book. Each mum will receive a package with literature about the importance of reading to children to develop early literacy.

Research shows that early oral language is developed best by interaction between adults and children from birth. This program encourages them to sing, play and read together.
